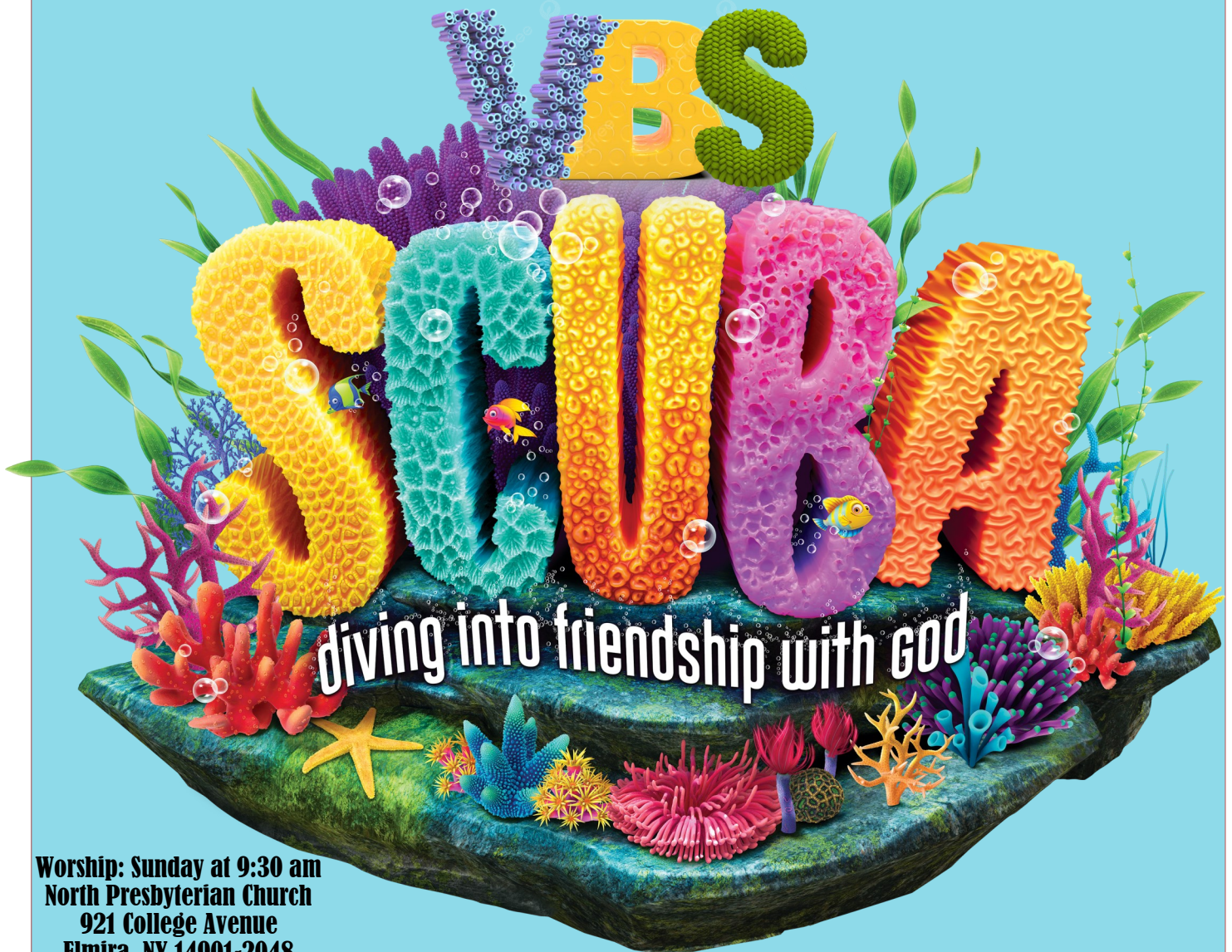

In June, we began a new ministry. On the fourth Tuesday of every month, I will be leading a worship service with Communion, at Woodbrook, one of the assisted living communities in our area.

For my first service, I chose Mark 4:26-32 for the scripture passage. After writing the short, short sermon, I realized that it could be adapted for my newsletter article. Here is an adaptation of my reflection on Mark 4:26-32.

The kingdom of God is like a mustard seed...I wonder what the disciples' reaction was to that parable. Jesus was comparing the kingdom of God to a weed.

A couple of weeks ago, I was at a conference listening to a Korean woman who had immigrated to Canada. She talked about how when she first moved to Canada how horrified she was to see what we do to dandelions. In Korea, dandelions are not weeds. They are food. The leaves are used as greens. The roots have medicinal purposes. To watch people poison, uproot, and try to eradicate dandelions was and remains to her a horrific tragedy. What we see as a weed was and is certainly not a weed to her.

We may not think of mustard plants as weeds, but the disciples would have and anyone whose land was infested with them would also see them as weeds. They may give shelter to the birds of the air, but they had and have an annoying tendency to grow in crop land. At the same time, the seeds of the plant Jesus was probably referring to were edible. It may not be the plant that we want to grow, but it is not a plant without value or purpose – just not the one we desire or intended.

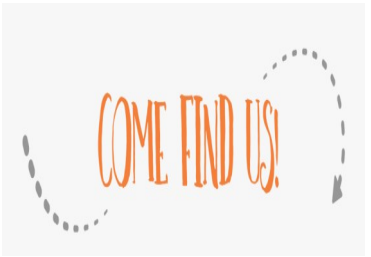
And yet, what does it mean that the kingdom is like a mustard seed? A plant that certainly could be cultivated but was not as valuable as grain and which could take up precious soil and water that would otherwise grow the more desired and sought after grain. A plant that keeps coming back again and again.

I do not know what the kingdom of God being like a mustard seed or even like a dandelion is for you – but for me – it is a sign of God's love and grace.

It is a sign that the kingdom of God cannot be stopped by us. It is a sign that God is beyond our control. It is a sign that our attempts to put God in a box will not work. It is a sign that God does not give up.

For if the kingdom of God is like the mustard seed or the dandelion, it means that the kingdom of God is like a single seed that can grow a single plant that in turn can produce many seeds and that in turn produce even more plants. For the love of God, the grace of Jesus Christ, the communion of the Holy Spirit are a lot like dandelions, plants that if we only look closer and allow our perceptions to be changed, are not weeds at all – but a beautiful creation of God that offers food and healing free for the taking wherever the wind may blow them.

While Deb is focusing on getting better, we'll do our best to make sure you have info from Children and Youth Ministry.

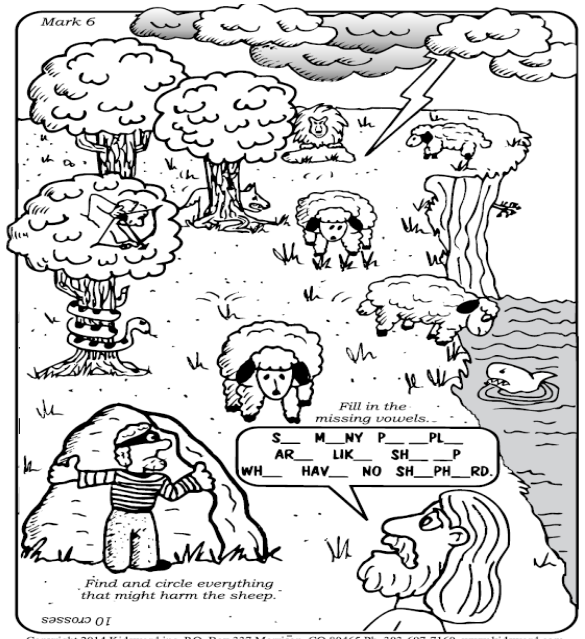
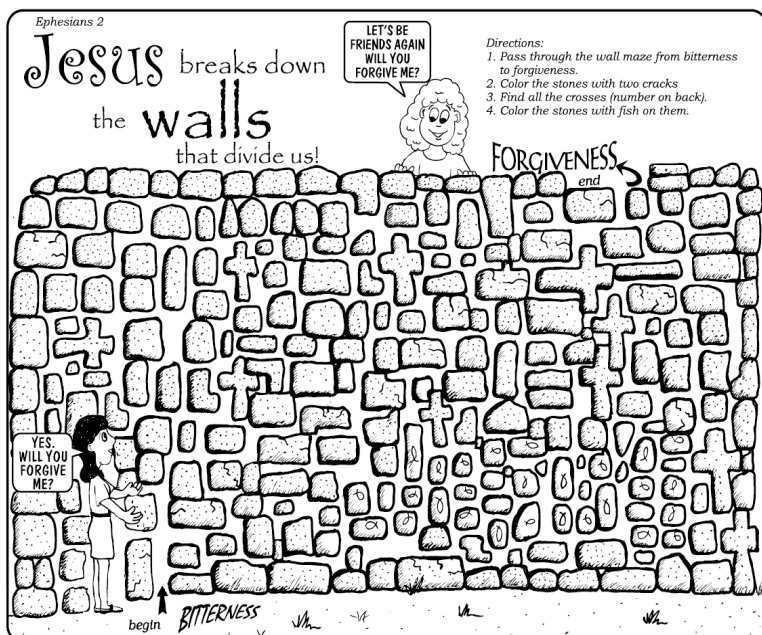
If any of you have not yet signed up for VBS, there's still time! You can register on the North Pres website (northpres.church) or call the church office (607-734-2977) for a registration form.

Located approximately 30 miles south of Buffalo, New York on the Cattaraugus Territory of the Seneca Nation of Indians, our congregation is very small. Despite our size, we regularly engage in reaching out to our community through selling breakfast and pies the first Saturday of each month (except July and August when it is too hot to be cooking in the kitchen) as well as holding sewing classes every Tuesday night. Women from the church and community are encouraged to work on their projects at their own pace, and an instructor is there to help if needed.



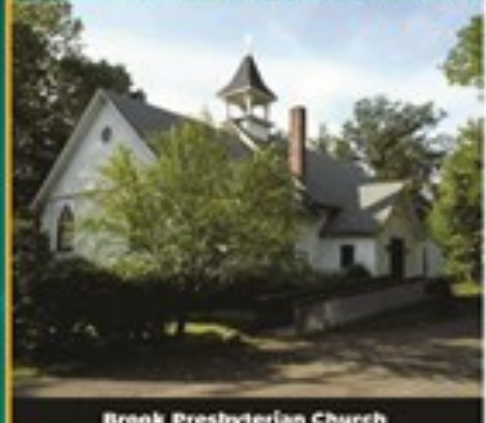

Brook Presbyterian Church

Located in Hillburn, NY, Brook is a historical church with a rich Native American/African American history. It is the original Ramapo/Munsee Lenape Nation Church No. 12. The families of Brook, along with a young Thurgood Marshall, led the fight that ultimately desegregated the Hillburn School in 1943, 11 years before Thurgood Marshall's landmark case, *Brown vs. The Board of Education*. Through depression and pandemic, Brook Church has continued to serve the community guided by God's word and blessing.

Shinnecock Presbyterian Church

Located in Southampton, Long Island, NY, Shinnecock Presbyterian Church is the oldest continuous reformed indigenous congregation in the United States and has served the Shinnecock since the 1600's, formally organized in 1741. Teacher, preacher and judge Rev. Samson Occum was the first Native American Presbyterian pastor ordained in 1793. September 2024 will mark 85 years of worship in the "new" Sanctuary, built after the Hurricane of 1938. June Meeting is celebrated at the church as a time of worship with Holy Communion, sometimes Baptisms, Confirmation, and Acceptance of New Members. It is also a Shinnecock Communal Time for Remembrance of Loved Ones/ Renewal/ Thanksgiving after passage of Winter into Springtime, Thanksgiving Feast (historically sometimes called First Fruits/Strawberry Thanksgiving/First Flowers/Flower Moon Time.) Shinnecock Labor Day Weekend Powwow is an end of summer gathering of Native People from across the hemisphere which continues to also benefit the Shinnecock Presbyterian Church and Shinnecock Nation programs.

Columbia Theological Seminary's Wonder of Worship program offering \$1,000 grants to congregations

The 'Quick Wins' grants will help faith communities that are working to nurture children in their worship and prayer lives

second round of grants of \$1,000 to congregations nationally looking to enhance the engagement of children in their corporate workspaces.

Wonder of Worship is funded through Lilly Endowment's [Nurturing Children Through Worship and Prayer](#)

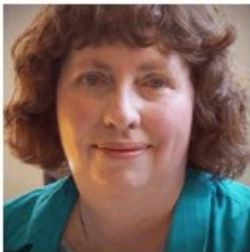
[Initiative](#). The aim of the national initiative is to support faith-based

organizations as they help children grow in faith and deepen their relationships with God.

The \$1,000 "Quick Wins" grants are available to congregations in any denomination through the [Lilly Endowment](#) and are part of an allotment to Columbia to provide for the nurturing of children in their worship and prayer lives.

"Churches in the first round of these grants have proposed many creative ways of using this money, from building worship training resources to hiring consultants to aid in writing more child-friendly liturgy," said Dr. Kathy L. Dawson, project director for the Wonder of Worship grant program. "Some are renovating cry rooms to enhance family participation in the service and others are developing programs for child leadership of worship. I've been amazed by the creativity in our partner churches so far and look forward to what this second round of Quick Wins grants will bring."

In this round, congregations looking to apply should conduct an inventory on what they are already doing in order to help ascertain where the greatest need is for the grant money. Congregations need to identify three to five areas in which they may make simple changes that can be done in the next year to engage children more fully in worship. The audit is available [here](#).

After the audit, congregations need to fill out a short registration form, including an itemized budget, to explain how the funds will be spent. That application is available [here](#). The application deadline is July 15.

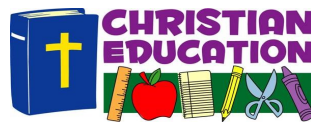

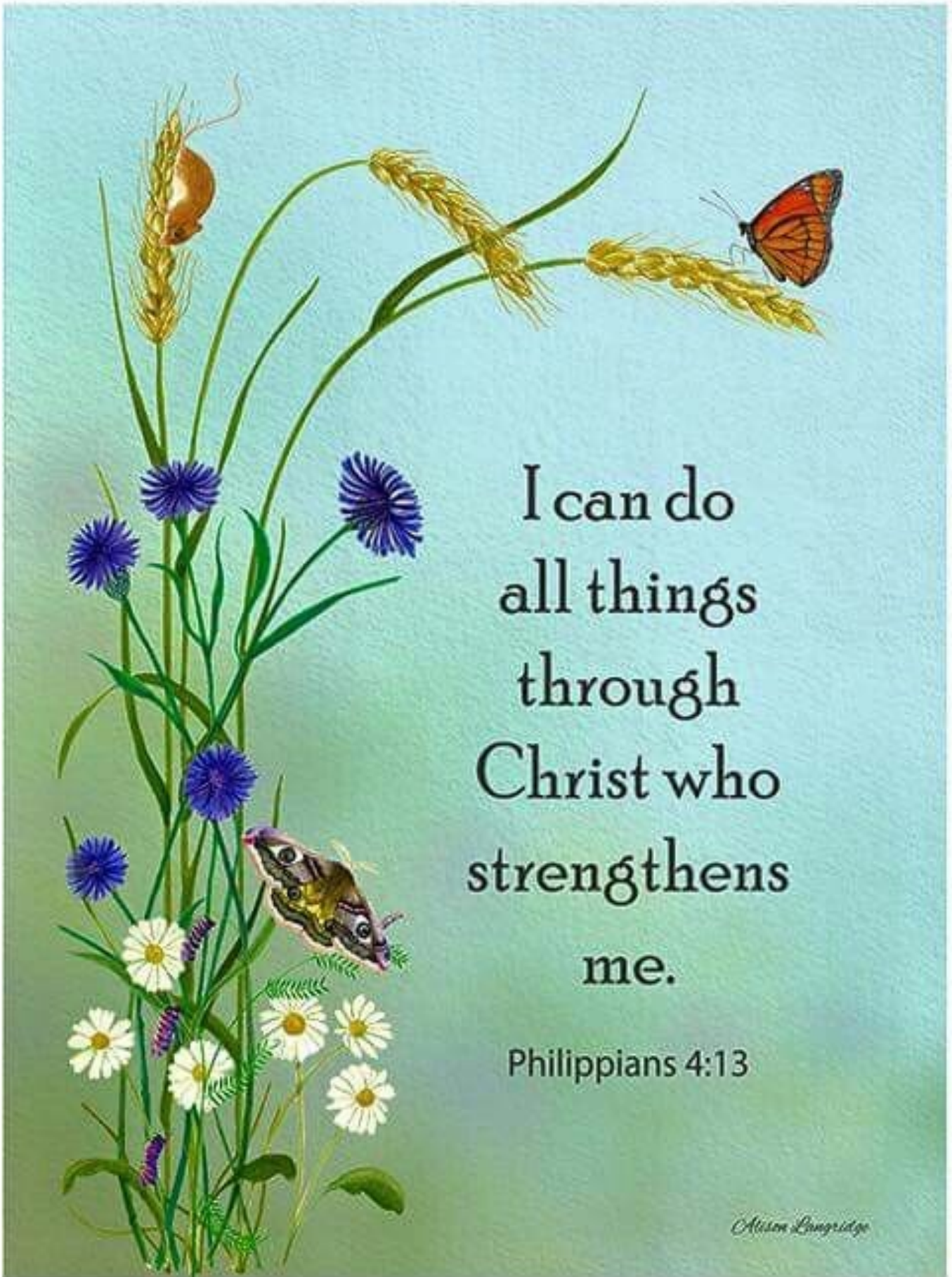
Pastor Hansen led a discussion on Chapters 6 & 7 of "Loving the Church You Lead."
