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August, 2024 A Letter from Pastor Hansen

Last month, I mentioned that I will be leading a worship service with the Lord's Supper at Woodbrook on the fourth Tuesday of each month. Two services in, it has been a learning experience.

After the most recent service, a person gestured for me to come over. After thanking me, they asked that, in the future, I provide more context for what is going on. Yes, they were told over the PA system there would be a worship service, but nothing more. By the time they arrived, any introductions were over and so they did not know who I was or much about the service other than the bulletin.

As I listened, I recognized that they were right and that I needed to approach this differently in future. I thanked them for their feedback and promised that I would try to do a better job of giving folks more context and a better idea of what is going on. Had I been in their shoes, I would have wanted the same thing.

So far, the sound system has not worked well, and I have had to go without. Yes, my voice does carry, and many of the people who join us have diminished hearing. Instead of me standing in front, I have learned to grab a chair and try to gather as many people around me as possible so that I can be heard without a microphone. Even if they do get the sound system to work, I do not think I will stand up in front, but instead will take the microphone with me to sit with those gathered.

I have also learned that the urge to sit in the back seems to be universal, whether it is at a local assisted living community or in a sanctuary. People naturally gravitate towards the back and like to stay there during worship. Because of the sound issues, I had to go them. When we want to be heard, we have to go to the people who we are addressing, not the other way around.

One of the things that I have grown to appreciate about faith is that faith in Christ is not about having all the answers. Faith in Christ Jesus frees us to learn, to adjust, to admit when we have messed up, to let go of our human-made rules, and to accept the mystery of God.

This means that we do not have to be right all the time and that saying "I don't know" is better than making up something on the spot. It frees us to do things differently in order that the needs of others are met. This is an astounding amount of freedom. And as the Apostle Paul tells us in Galatians 5:13-15, we were and are granted this freedom in Christ to serve one another in love.

The freedom granted to us in Christ Jesus is an astounding amount of freedom. It is the freedom to worship differently and to have different theological beliefs. This is the freedom that, through the Holy Spirit, transforms our hearts and our minds and opens us up to love – for at the heart of loving our neighbors and one another is our willingness to learn and not to have all the answers.




Children and Youth Ministry August 2024







COMMUNICATIONS

I hope your summer is going well and you are using it as a time to rest and renew. We wait so long for this season, and then just as it starts, we are prompted with ads for back to school supplies! No! we cry and jump in the pool, or pick blueberries, or hike the Glen. At North, Sunday School and choirs are on hiatus, committees skip July meetings, and some of our volunteers get a break (thank you food pantry for continuing operation!). Just like those school supply ads, though, the church must keep planning and preparing for the coming year - Rally Day will soon be upon us! To assist our small paid staff, all the church's operations and programs and ministries depend upon volunteers...they depend upon YOU! God made it that way. God knows how fulfilled and whole you will feel as a part of His community of believers. There truly is something for everyone, every interest, even for those who only have a little snippet of time to give. No big commitments, no worries if you try something and it's not for you. Water a plant, pick up chairs after a fellowship dinner, help out one Sunday in wee worship, bring some celery and carrot sticks to balance out the array of cookies. Think of it like going to a stream and dipping in the toes of one foot to see how the water is...doesn't it feel good? Soothing? You might venture in a little further, up to your ankles, and start to notice the little minnows, the smooth stones, a tiny hop toad. The hot sun and cool clear water beckon and you jump into that deep swimming hole beneath the beautiful waterfall feeling renewed and refreshed and happy! Lean into the Holy Spirit for that bravery while you peruse the following - the Chair of any group would jump for joy for your help:

Summary of Boards and Committees

Audit Committee – Chaired by a member of the Congregation along with two members nominated by the Nominating Committee and elected by the Congregation, serving two-year terms that may overlap so there is continuity along with a fresh perspective. This committee annually conducts a full review between January and mid-April of all church financial records for the previous year and submits a written report to Session and the Congregation.

Buildings and Grounds Committee – Moderated by an Elder on Session with members recruited by the Nominating Committee or the Chair. These members shall serve for a term of one year not to exceed three consecutive years. This committee under the supervision of Session is responsible for all church properties, buildings, and equipment including, but not limited to, repairs, maintenance, building use, borrowing of church furniture or equipment, and insurance coverage.

Communications and Technology Committee – The committee goal is to provide oversight for unified clear, accessible, and consistent information about the church's mission, ministry, events, and calendar to the community and to the congregation utilizing the North Star, email, social media, screens, Sunday bulletins, and signage on College Avenue. This committee oversees the various equipment technologies and services necessary, including, but not limited to, audio/visual systems, contracts for web hosting, email accounts, and the church website.

Congregational Life Committee – Moderated by an Elder on Session with members recruited by the Nominating Committee and individually commissioned Deacons. These members shall serve for a term of one year not to exceed three consecutive years. This committee is charged with strengthening the Congregation by bringing members together outside of the worship service (fellowship), reviewing the Active Membership roll and recommending to Session those who should be transferred to the Associate Membership roll. This committee also organizes and coordinates the Deacons who minister to those in need, ill, friendless, homebound, hospitalized, or in distress.

Education Committee – Chaired by an Elder serving on Session with members recruited by the Nominating Committee or the Chair. These members shall serve for a term of one year not to exceed three consecutive years. This committee is charged with providing a variety of learning and mission opportunities throughout the year and devotional resources for adults and children including youth ministry, wee worship, and Sunday school, and reporting that curricula to Session annually. This committee shall ensure the classrooms are in good repair and well-stocked, recommend confirmation classes, provide Communion training for children/parents, encourage attendance at Camp Whitman, recommend youth safety policies for Session approval, and bring the youth into the life of the church.

Finance Committee – Chaired by an Elder serving on Session with members recruited by the Nominating Committee or the Chair. These members shall serve for a term of one year not to exceed three consecutive years. This committee is charged with educating the Congregation about sacrificial giving, establishing a stewardship program, developing an annual budget, communicating the financial status of the church to the Congregation, and overseeing that financial audits and reviews are undertaken.

Mission/Outreach Committee - Chaired by an Elder serving on Session with members recruited by the Nominating Committee or the Chair. These members shall serve for a term of one year not to exceed three consecutive years. This committee is charged with planning, organizing, initiating, and participating in events that bring the good news of Jesus Christ to all, including the coordination of welcoming and hospitality to visitors, maintaining the "meet your neighbor" pads, maintaining demographic information about the area, collaborating on new member classes, congregational and community dinners, mission support, mission trip opportunities, and keeping the community and Congregation aware of church activities.

Nominating Committee – Chaired by an Elder serving on Session with four additional members elected by the Congregation annually. This committee is charged with recruiting members to serve as elders, deacons, at-large members of the Nominating Committee and members of the Audit Committee to be presented at the Annual Meeting of the Congregation for a congregational vote. This committee assists committee chairs with the recruitment of members for the various committees.

Staff Relations Committee – Chaired by an Elder serving on Session with members recruited by the Nominating Committee or the Chair. These members shall serve for a term of one year not to exceed three consecutive years. This committee is charged with overseeing the personnel issues for the church, including, but not limited to, writing and reviewing the job descriptions of all church staff members and evaluating the job performance of each staff member annually, recommending any salary adjustments, including the terms of call for the Pastor, communicating this information to the Finance Committee for budget preparation, and reviewing the personnel policy annually.

Worship and Music Committee - Chaired by an Elder serving on Session with members recruited by the Nominating Committee or the Chair. These members shall serve for a term of one year not to exceed three consecutive years. This committee is charged with collaborating with the Pastor on the various worship services held throughout the year, including style and time of worship, and presenting the annual schedule of the Lord's Supper to Session for approval.



Rivers of Music: Paul's Story - - will wickham, words

The title flowed naturally from Paul Holland's life story. Paul grew up just a few blocks from the Kanawha River in Charleston, West Virginia, studied music on the banks of the Hocking River at Athens Ohio, and now, with grandchildren living nearby, happily calls the valley of the Chemung River home.

Paul is the quintessential humble musician. Most who have sung or played in any of his multitude of musical endeavors has loved both Paul and the experience. His passion for music came early in life when he discovered the ability to sing melody or harmony equally well. With additional inspiration from Marching Band, formal music education at Ohio University, and the best memories from his years in Parochial School, Paul eagerly came to work as the band leader at Elmira's Notre Dame High School in the late 1970's. Since coming to Elmira, Paul has sung with and directed countless choirs and ensembles and is the founding Music Director of Elmira's

Common Time Choir.

in silence he knelt down to pray, the Parish priest saw him and knowing his passion, Father Davis invites in his song. Several choirs later, this Common Time founder

brings many singers and ringers along, his passion for music freely given to all.
