December, 2024 A Letter from Pastor Hansen

It is that time of year again. The days get darker earlier and earlier. The gray of the clouds feels different. Thicker and more permanent. It is almost as if the clouds are daring us to even imagine what is on the other side of them. Most of the leaves have dropped. I have learned since moving to the east coast that not all trees drop their leaves at the same time which explains why the two large oak trees in front of the church sanctuary along College Avenue are still holding on to a good number of their leaves. It's that time of year in which the vibrant colors that dominate the summer and fall go dormant along with the trees.

Depending on your traditions and your desire to decorate, you may have brought the rich, warm reds, yellows, and oranges that are no longer outside, inside. Colors that soon after Thanksgiving will be replaced by the colors of Advent and Christmas. Our first Thanksgiving here was pretty low key. It was November 2020 and the COVID numbers in our area were through the roof. No one was visiting us, and we were not visiting anyone either. At some point either on the Friday or the Saturday after Thanksgiving Day, we, as a family, walked over to Haskins Gardens and got our Christmas tree.

Before 2020, we generally waited a little bit before we got a tree. We certainly did not get the tree the weekend after Thanksgiving. We were rarely home that weekend. But that changed in 2020. In 2020, we, and everyone else, were home a lot and now Sunday was a workday for me. The days of just leaving for the weekend, planned or on a whim, were gone.

In the first creation story, we are told that God created the moon, the sun, and the stars so that we would be able to see time pass. They were to give us days and nights, seasons and years. It is because of the sun and moon that we even know what time is. We now have atomic clocks that measure time by the oscillation of atoms. You can even buy an atomic clock on Amazon for around \$35. But even atoms are part of creation and are subject to the passing of time – which for us is still measured by the length of a day. The time it takes for the earth to rotate on its axis and the sun to shine across the entirety of the planet.

Seasons are a gift of grace. They remind us not only of the cycle of life and death on a grand scale, but one on a smaller scale. They are what remind us that as important as our traditions are to us, they too are seasonal. Traditions change because each time we approach a particular season, a particular day, a particular time, we have changed, and we are not the same people we were even the day before. And when traditions change, new ones are made. Some of the things that I find most wondrous about the Christian faith are our traditions and that our traditions are allowed to change as we change and as the Holy Spirit takes us to new places and times.

Had you asked me when we lived in Pendleton, whether I wanted to get a Christmas tree Thanks-giving weekend, I would have said, "No, that's too early, we need to wait." Now, I enjoy walking over to Haskins Gardens Thanksgiving Weekend and picking a tree. It is a new tradition. We all walk together, and we all carry the tree home together. I know that someday this tradition will also change, but I am going to enjoy it while it lasts.


December 2024





Renovation TRANSFORMING THE LIVES OF MEN HOUSE

At Renovation House we have the privilege of seeing how God moves in the lives of those we serve as they journey through our one-year discipleship training. Perhaps the best way to understand the breadth and depth of God's work here is to share one person's account of being lifted by Him from ashes and despair to beauty and purpose.

This is Jeff's story:

When I was about six years old, my parents went through a messy divorce, followed by a series of relationships that were rarely healthy for my sister and I. At the same time, I was constantly bullied at school. I felt trapped in a box of utter chaos with no way out, and everywhere I went seemed to lead to more trauma. My intense emotions had been bottled up, and I desperately looked for a way to release them. I found that self-harm could serve that purpose, and it became my "drug" of choice. I literally became addicted to the pain I would cause myself. Feeling increasingly hopeless, I began to



have suicidal thoughts. My first attempt to end my life, and my first stay in a psychiatric ward, occurred when I was 13.

During high school I was constantly in and out of programs and mental hospitals, but only became progressively worse. I ran the gamut: outpatient hospital treatment, inpatient mental health facilities, therapy sessions with psychologists, many medications prescribed by psychiatrists, and eventually ECT (electroconvulsive therapy), a treatment reserved for the most severe cases of depression. But all of these failed. My worst -- and nearly fatal -- suicide attempt occurred while I was an inpatient in Bellevue Hospital's psychiatric unit. I was hopeless, suicidal, and out of options. I was either heading towards the street or a state hospital for an indefinite amount of time. I needed something that would work.

Little did I know that God had a plan for me since the very beginning. Throughout my life, even when lost in utter brokenness, God our Father was extending His hand to me. He was standing there, knocking on the door, waiting for me to answer it. As I was ending my stay at Bellevue and my direction was hazy, I got a call from my dad, with whom I had recently reconciled. What he said would completely change my life: "What if I told you there was a place where you could heal, recover, and try something new?" He told me that this was a Christian program, and I actually felt a glimmer of hope, despite considering myself to be an atheist. I knew I needed to try something. I was in bondage, at the end of my rope, and the last thing atheism had to offer was any shred of hope. I decided to give faith a shot. This would prove to be a life-saving, and life-changing decision.

I left Bellevue and stepped away from the medical world. I had an interview with Judah at Renovation House, told him my situation, and was accepted into the program. They definitely took a chance on me, given the severity of my history of depression. During my first conversation with Pastor John Earley I had said, "If this Jesus stuff doesn't work, I'm checking out" -- meaning that I would end my life. But I

have no doubt that the Spirit of God intervened on my behalf, giving Judah, Rev John and the rest of the Renovation team enough peace to welcome me in.

I entered the program cold-turkey, off all of my meds, and yet felt a peace that I had never experienced in my life. I felt as though I had stepped into a whole new world. I saw the fruit of God's Spirit -- the peace, joy, and love that everyone carried with them -- and wanted that for myself. I was told to start reading the Gospels, and one day I turned to Chapter 5 in the Gospel of Mark. There I read the story of the man possessed by a multitude of demons, crying out and cutting himself with stones. I saw in this man my own story. I saw how Jesus set him free in an instant. I saw that I needed to seek my life's purpose from God. I saw all of this because the Lord had opened my eyes.

Within a month at Renovation House, during a church service in December of 2019, God would save me, call me to ministry, baptize me in the Holy Spirit, and permanently set me free from my past. In that

moment I was free from all of the depression, anxiety, self-harm, and suicidal thoughts with which I had struggled for years. I would give my all to Jesus, every part of me, from there on out. I completed Renovation House's year-long program, felt God's call to stay longer as an intern, and then was led to enroll in a Bible college for a couple of years. I recently graduated, and felt the call to come back home — to Renovation House. I am soon to be engaged to the love of my life, and excitedly look towards the future. Now I have the honor and the blessing to serve the men and women here, and to share God's redemption story of my life. I cannot wait to see what He does next.

If it had not been for God using Renovation House to transform my life, I doubt I would be alive today. I am so thankful for each of you who support this ministry, which continues to change the course of many lives, as it did mine. Like me, those who were once broken and have experienced healing can now become men and women who take the gospel to a broken world – just like the man whom Jesus set free in the story I read in the Gospel of Mark:

As Jesus was getting into the boat, the man who had been demon-possessed begged to go with him. Jesus did not let him, but said, "Go home to your own people and tell them how much the Lord has done for you, and how he has had mercy on you." So the man went away and began to tell in the Decapolis how much Jesus had done for him. And all the people were amazed. (Mark 5:18-20)

Jeff now serves as a productive staff member at Renovation House, drawing upon his life experiences and education to help others who are seeking -- and finding -- freedom from addiction, depression, and spiritual darkness. Although he is still young in years, like Timothy he has a wealth of Godly wisdom to offer our students.

At the end of his story, Jeff expressed his thanks to God, from whom all blessings flow, and to all of you who support Renovation House. We who are his co-workers in this ministry do likewise. Your ongoing support allows us to continue this life-changing work, and is greatly appreciated.



From the Finance Committee

The Finance Committee has been exploring options for funds that have been sitting in our savings account. These are funds that have not been designated by the session for a particular ministry. Since savings accounts pay very little interest the committee looked for alternatives. We recommended to Session, and they approved, opening a custodial account with Chemung Canal Trust. This account retains the liquidity of a savings account but has a higher rate of return. As we continue to monitor our investments we will look for additional opportunities to improve our overall return.



More than 40 families had a very enjoyable Thanksgiving dinner due to the Food Bank of the Southern Tier -- and to YOU.

The NPC Food Pantry was given 12 turkeys and 30 turkey breasts through the Food Bank to distribute to our clients. Due to donations from this congregation, Westside United Methodist Church, Yoga and others, these families not only received turkeys, they were handed bags with all the sides -- mashed potatoes, stuffing, gravy, yams, cranberry sauce and green beans.

What a wonderful way to start the holiday season.

The Moderator determined that a quorum was present and the meeting was convened with a reading of Scripture, devotions, and prayer by Wendy Swatling.

The Moderator acted as clerk pro tem by the assent of the gathered Session members.

The Agenda was approved with the addition of an item to discuss the December 15 2024 Session meeting. Motion by Jim Mosher / Seconded by Steve Allison / motion carried.

The minutes of the Session meeting of September 15, 2024 were approved. Motion by Wendy Swatling / Seconded by Jim Mosher / motion carried.

The minutes of the Session meeting of October 20, 2024 were approved. Motion by Steve Allison / Seconded by Tim Allison / motion carried.

The moderator read the thank you letter we received from First Presbyterian Church of Rome, NY, dated October 13 2024, thanking our congregation for its donation of \$5,000 towards the restoration and rebuilding of the sanctuary and steeple destroyed by a tornado this past summer.

Clerk's Report. Received as presented.

<u>Treasurer's Report</u>. Received as presented. Motion by Nancy Isaacs / Seconded by Steve Allison / motion carried.

<u>Presbytery Report</u>. The next Presbytery meeting will be held on November 19, 2024, at First Presbyterian Church of Elmira, NY.

<u>Pastor's Report</u>. Pastor Hansen reported that he continues to make in-person visits and make telephone calls to our homebound members and friends of NPC. He reported that the funeral for Hal and Donna Wolfe was held at NPC on Saturday, November 2. At the upcoming presbytery meeting, he will be elected and installed as the Vice-Moderator of the Presbytery. This is a three-year obligation in which he will serve one year as vice-moderator, one year as moderator of presbytery, and one year as moderator of the presbytery's General Council. It was noted that Pastor Hansen is going as part of the presbytery leadership as Jeff Richards is rotating off as the moderator of General Council. Pastor Hansen also reported that he is rotating off of the presbytery's Operations Committee.

NPC Board of Session

Written reports were received from Finance and Worship & Music.

Christian Education reported that on November 30 at 8 a.m., they will be filling Christmas Stockings for children of our pantry clients; and that the stockings will be distributed the following Saturday, December 7, from 10 a.m. to 1 p.m. First Presbyterian Church of Elmira is contributing to this project.

Pat Richards led the first reading of the budget.

During the discussions of the budget, the subject of the devotions we generally provide to our members and send out to our homebound members and friends came up. After much discussion, it was agreed to move this line item and responsibility from Christian Education to Congregational Life. Motion by David Hansen / Seconded by Tim Allison / motion carried.

Other actions taken by the Session:

Approve the 2025 Communion Schedule proposed by Worship & Music. Motion carried.

Our church administrator has accepted a part-time job with the Presbytery of Geneva. This would be in addition to her duties here. To make this work, the Presbytery of Geneva will contract with NPC for NPC to provide the presbytery administrative services. This would make Gretchen a full-time employee of NPC and entitle her to medical insurance benefits pursuant to our current employee handbook.

A motion was made to authorize Pastor Hansen and Wendy Swatling to negotiate on behalf of NPC to come to an agreement with the Presbytery of Geneva to provide administrative services to the presbytery and upon successful negotiation of an agreement to reclassify Gretchen's position as a full-time position when she begins her new duties. Motion made by Jim Mosher / Seconded by Steve Allison / Motion carried.

A motion was made to pay up to one-half of the cost of High Deductible Health Plan offered by Board of Pensions (as is required by the Board of Pensions) or \$400 per month, whichever is greater, towards a full-time employee's medical insurance premiums and the employee shall be responsible for the remaining cost of the premium, including, the cost of insuring a dependent. The employee may choose whichever medical insurance plan best fits their needs. The employee's portion of the premiums shall be paid by wage withholding over the 26 pay periods each calendar year. Motion made by Nancy Isaacs / Seconded by Tim Allison / motion carried.

To calculate the employee's share of insurance premiums, we will take the annual cost of the premiums subtract our contribution to the premiums and divide the remaining sum by 26.

It was and is understood that the above motion does not apply to teaching elders, whose benefits are covered by a separate section of the employee handbook and are also subject to the compensation requirements of the Presbytery of Geneva. These benefits, including health insurance benefits, are negotiated annually and approved at the annual congregational meeting.

The December 15 Meeting will be a potluck meeting and will be held in Willits Hall. We will discuss the final chapter of our book study at the meeting as well as approve the budget.
